## **Building Update**

The building committee and the Board of Directors continue to be frustrated by ongoing issues affecting the upgrade and renovation of our clubrooms. The Draft Master Plan for Thompson's Reserve has been completed by the Bass Coast Shire and will be the vehicle for us to use when we have to finally vacate our present site. It is now apparent that any relocation will be subject to availability of Government funding and it may be 10 to 12 years (or more) into the future at an estimated cost of over \$3 million. Due to this time frame we are now in the process of finalising a new lease agreement to give us continued tenancy on our present site after our current lease expires in 2015. During the last few weeks we have met with the Bass Coast Shire to commence the "due process" to renew our lease, hopefully for a further 21 years, but this will be decided by the DSE. This process includes the preparation of a business plan, preparation of a documented case as to why we need to renew our lease, a visit from the Valuer General to assess the rental fee, as well as providing other documentation to support our application. Meanwhile an advertisement will be placed in the local papers by the Bass Coast Shire advertising our intention to re-lease the site. All of this is very time consuming and adds to the frustration of achieving the best outcome.

In anticipation of receiving a lease renewal we have met with Luis Castagna (Lumel Project Managers) of Leongatha. Luis has kindly offered his services as Project Manager for a building upgrade and has already met with us on and off site to prepare a design and plans to firstly construct a new kitchen/toilets and committee/secretary room at the eastern end of the building. Stage 2 will be the renovation of the western end including the bar and a new entrance area. Stage 3 (depending on funds) will be the minor renovation of the top floor. In his opinion, in discussion with us, it would be cost effective to retain the top floor and carry out Stage 1 and 2 first. This would provide modern new facilities downstairs and also increase the seating area in conjunction with modernising the building. His aim is to keep within our budget and spending only the funds we presently have in hand. When we have the conceptual plans for the latest proposal we will be able to convey more information to members through the pages of this newsletter.
