Recent robberies and Security.

As most members would be aware of we have had two unlawful entries into our club rooms in one week. On Monday 29th October at 5.50am.a person or persons unknown, entered the building by removing a window in the ladies room. A loss of \$45 in cash from the ladies office area occurred along with the removal of a privately owned a lap top computer from the office. Entry in to the bar area occurred but no loss of money was involved. Again, on Wednesday 31st October, at 4.10am, the clubrooms were illegally entered, by the same method, removal of a window, with the bar being the target. Fortunately, no cash was taken as it was in a secure place, however, an unknown quantity of alcohol was stolen. On both occasions the police attended and fingerprinting etc was carried out in attempt to identify the offender(s). You could say we got out of it relatively lightly both times, however, the mess and damage to the office and bar was an inconvenience and leaves us with some expense and cleaning up we didn't need. The alarm system was activated and Bass Security contacted Bar Manager Bob Pritchard to attend. Bob responded accordingly by going to the clubrooms in the early hours. This is very much appreciated, however no member should be put in a "risk" situation such as this. As a result of the robberies the Board has met and instigated the purchase and installation of a security upgrade to include the latest technology available to monitor and alarm our clubrooms. Once the new security system is in place the process of entry and exit from the clubrooms will change, with "after dark" hours involving a new method of alarming the building of which members will be advised accordingly. Members are reminded at all times to be security conscious and make sure green fees, bar takings, raffle money and other club funds collected be secured in the safe manner required. Also, when leaving the clubrooms and grounds, be sure that all doors, windows and gates are locked and where applicable the alarm system turned on. Chairman and Directors IBC.

What's happening in the corner?

I am pleased to announce that Inverloch Bowling Club has been successful in its application to host a Broadband for Seniors kiosk (BFS) The Australian Government has committed \$15 million over three years (2008-2011) for the provision of 2000 internet kiosks to organisations that support seniors and want to host a Broadband for Seniors Kiosk and participate in this project. The Government has extended this project into Phase 2 ending in 30 June 2013 with a limited number of BFS kiosks available. And we were successful! The project aims are to provide seniors with free access to Broadband for Seniors Kiosks, help them gain confidence using computer technology, and to build community participation and social inclusion amongst older Australians. It benefits organisations that want to complement their facilities with new technology to support their seniors with free access to the Internet, computers and basic training. It benefits seniors who feel threatened by new technology and the Internet. It will enable seniors to learn for free how to use a computer, access the Internet and communicate with friends and family via email. At no cost to the Club, it has received 2 desks, 3 tutor chairs & 2 desktop computers with keyboards, mouse & web cameras from NEC and Officeworks. Rebate \$30 per month for the cost of our existing internet connection will also be available. The software on the computers will allow for members to learn email, internet & word processing. The Host Administrator is Rob Huntley. He is the contact point for the day to day kiosk administration & communication between NEC. The Host Contact is Carol Waters. She is the overall contact point between NEC and the Club. Volunteer tutors are Gail Burge, Rob Huntley & Carol Waters. We envisage the BFS Kiosk to be operating 5 days a week (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Sunday) in split 2 x 2 hours shifts - one shift in the morning, another in the afternoon. The Kiosk will be open by Appointment Only during these shift times. Members may just come in and use the computers or tutoring will be available if requested. We are urgently looking for 'Kiosk Supervisors' to help man the shifts. If you have a couple of hours to spare & have some computer knowledge, we would love to hear from you.
