HOW OUR CLUB WORKS

Welcome to our club. In fact it is your club, and you are a valued member, and like all fellow members you enjoy a game of bowls. However for this to happen a lot of work behind the scenes has to be done by club members. Many long term members will know what this means, however many newer members may be unaware how our club works, so we have endeavoured to provide this information to help all understand how our club functions. Firstly, we have a Management Committee consisting of 14 delegated members. It is this group who manage the club's expenditure and financial matters. We then have both Women's and Men's section office bearers (10 elected members in each group), who are responsible for managing all aspects of our club's bowling operations, which include social bowls, tournaments, club championships and inter-club pennant teams and selection. As well as these groups, we have special committee groups who take care of important activities around the club, these being the Bar Committee, Catering Committee, Greens Committee and a Maintenance Committee. These committees are also strongly supported by many individual efforts by many club members. The old saying "many hand make light work" is held in high regard in our club, and an extra pair of hands is always welcome. Our bowling year is broken into two seasons; Summer Season which starts the first Saturday of September (Opening Day) and runs through to approx. the end of April. This is our busiest season when the finer weather is more accommodating to the sport of bowls. During this period we promote a strong program of social bowls, men's, women's and mixed days, club championships, inter club tournaments and pennant. The winter season runs from May to the end of August, the main activity over this season is mixed social bowls. As we are now at the start of our Summer Season, the following calendar will commence.

Mondays both greens are closed for maintenance.

Tuesdays Ladies Pennant is played.

Wednesdays Ladies Social Bowls.

Thursdays Men's Social Bowls.

Saturdays Men's Pennant is played including Bankers.

Outside these scheduled events we may run special social events, otherwise all members are encouraged to enjoy a "roll up" or play a "grudge match".

For more information on social bowls, pennant selection and play, check the notice boards inside the club house or if you are not sure ask a fellow member.
